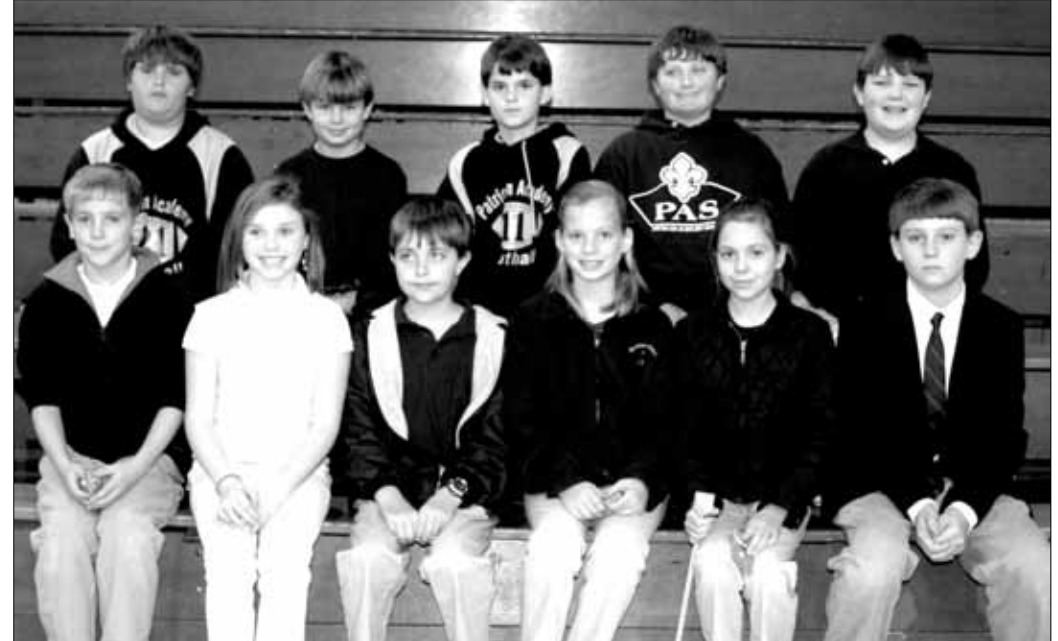
Patrician awards honor students, top readers

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A letter to SCHS parents

Dear Parents
This letter is to inform you of a planned event in the month of January. This event is being planned in cooperation with Mr. Bill Gibson, Director Choctaw County Emergency Management, and Mr. Mike Lofton, Senior Associate of the Paratus Group. Mr. Lofton is the director of the Louisiana Office. His home office is located in Macon, Ga. While involved in this upcoming event Mr. Lofton will be the senior controller. Before I get into specifics of this event I would like to stress again, THIS IS A DRILL!

This drill will consist of a total school evacuation. The students from Southern Choctaw High School will be accompanied by their teacher(s) and will go to Southern Choctaw Elementary School as part of this drill. At this time Southern Choctaw Elementary will be in total lock down as part of this drill.

This drill will consist of some individuals, posing as terrorists, taking over a classroom. All the students at Southern Choctaw High School will be participating in this drill. Some of the students will participate by playing the role of hostages. The remaining students will participate by being part of the evacuation process. Local law enforcement and medical professionals will be part of this drill. I can personally assure you that NO harm will come to your children because of this drill. This is intended to mean the students playing the role of hostages as well as those being part of the evacuation process. Your child's safety is the reason for this drill.

This drill will be conducted on Friday January 19, 2007. It will take place during the last two periods of the regular school day. The overall purpose for this drill is to help Southern Choctaw High School, Southern

Choctaw Elementary School, as well as local law enforcement prepare in the unlikely event that something similar to this ever happen in the future.

Southern Choctaw High School and Southern Choctaw Elementary School are both very fortunate to be asked to be part of this drill. This will be the first drill of this nature conducted in the state of Alabama. Observers from the State Department of Education will be present to observe the drill so they will be able to ascertain the effectiveness of the drill and plan for future drills, of this same nature, at other schools.

Again, I want to personally assure you that your child will NOT be in any danger because of this drill. As I stated previously, THIS IS A DRILL! Please do not be alarmed if you hear of these events on your police scanners or from people in the general public.
