

Lewis lights up Marengo

■ Senior Kylie Lewis hits four 3-pointers to lead 4th-ranked Patrician past Marengo in Butler

BUTLER — Point guard Kylie Lewis has been lauded all year by Patrician fans for her exceptional handling of the offense. On Tuesday night in Butler, the senior let fans know she can shoot the ball too, hitting four 3-pointers en route to a 14-point night to lead the Saints past Marengo in easy fashion.

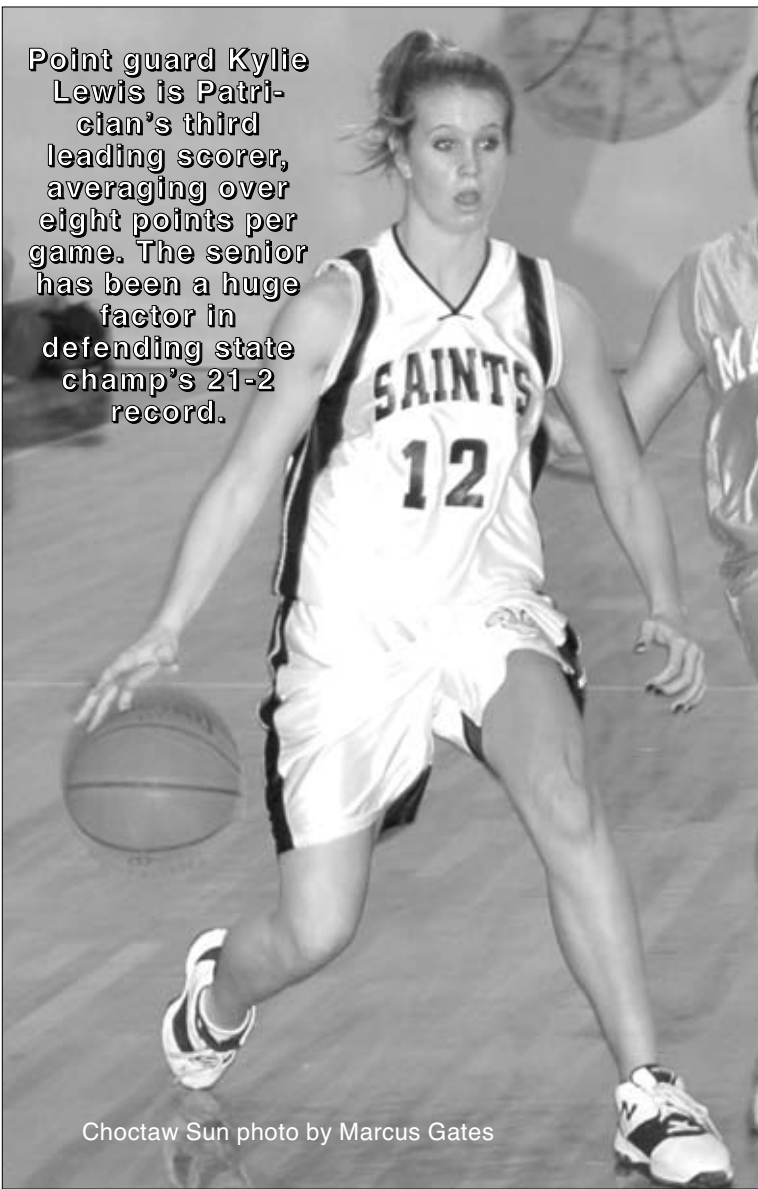
“Being a point guard takes a lot of energy,” commented Saints head coach Wendell Barr after his team’s 43-23 dismantling of the Lady Longhorns. “Usually a point guard is too tired to be a strong shooter, but Kylie has been very effective in the scoring column. She has really hit some key shots for us this year.”

Lewis averages just over eight points per game, good for third on the team behind Stephanie Caudle (12 ppg) and Anna Lewis (9 ppg). Kylie’s contributions scoring and taking good care of the ball are a big reason that Patrician is ranked fourth in the state with a 21-2 record.

In the win over Marengo, Stephanie Caudle scored nine points with 11 rebounds, while Nancy Dasis scored six points with two assist and two steals. Anna Lewis added four points and nine rebounds for the Saints.

Patrician will now play at Sparta on Friday (1/26) and then return home to face Wayne on Monday, January 29th.

Point guard Kylie Lewis is Patrician’s third leading scorer, averaging over eight points per game. The senior has been a huge factor in defending state champ’s 21-2 record.
