The only deviation from our new schedule will be a handful of weeks during the year that contain major state/national holidays, such as Thanksgiving, Christmas, etc., when we will have only one issue – which will be on sale on Wednesdays. Those holiday schedules will be announced far in advance so that readers/advertisers can plan accordingly.

We are also pleased to announce that, effective Monday, Jan. 8th, the **Sun's** new Butler office will open in the former Bible Book Store location at 214

West Smith Street.

The Butler office will be open Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays for the convenience of our readers, customers and advertisers in the north end of the county. You can come by and purchase office supplies, send a fax, get copies made, take care of subscription renewals, drop off news announcements and photos, pay on an account, or just visit with us and enjoy a fresh, hot cup of coffee compliments of **The Sun**.

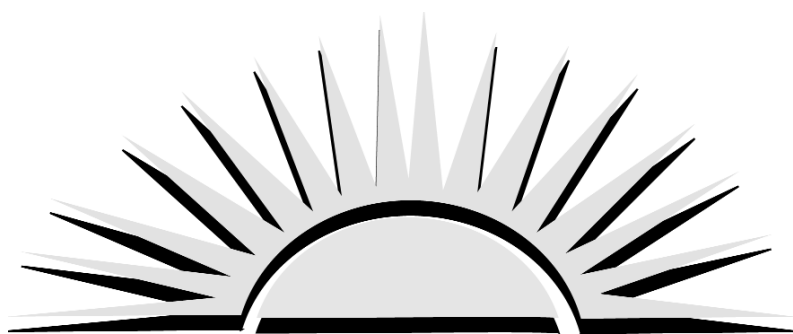
