

**JOURNEY from 1B**

**(10-5) South Choctaw 58, Central 19**

The Rebels traveled to Selma for the first of what would be two area wins over Central in two days. In this one, Arielle paced the Rebels with 14 points and Trystan Mosley added 12.

**(11-5) South Choctaw 90, Central 26**

Due to a cancellation prior in the week, the Rebels had to play Central on back-to-back nights. After the easy win in Selma on Thursday (1/11), the Rebels turned around and put this nearly 70-point beat-down on Central on Friday night in Toxey. The win moved the Rebels to 4-0 in area and basically ended any drama in the race for the regular season area title. Arielle led the team again with 22 points. Mosley, who hit six 3-pointers in the two-game stretch, finished with 14.

**(12-5) South Choctaw 52, Coosa Valley 21**

The Rebels took a 29-9 halftime lead against a Coosa side that many thought was a team to beat in Class A. Trystan Mosley was SCA's top scorer with 14 points thanks to four 3-pointers. Kwasniak had 11, while Koen and Kate each had eight.

**(12-6) South Choctaw 45, Patrician 49**

This was the senior-laden Rebels last shot at knocking off rival Patrician. Although in Toxey, the Rebels would squander an 18-7 first period lead and falter late in the game with just ten second half points. The loss was the third of the year to Patrician, which is the Rebels' lone blemish on an otherwise spotless season. The loss would be the last of the season for the Rebels as they closed with an 11-game win streak. Kate and Arielle each had 13 points against PA.

**(13-6) South Choctaw 59, Cornerstone 28**

Dahlberg rallied the Rebels after the disheartening loss to PA with a 22-point effort in the first of two games in Birmingham. In the win, Kate added six assists, four rebounds and four steals.

**(14-6) South Choctaw 50, Shelby 26**

After spending the night in B'ham, South Choctaw would dismantle Shelby on their way back to Toxey thanks to another great game from Kate. The senior scored 23 points to go with seven steals and four rebounds. In the two game road-trip, Arielle combined for 18 points and 14 rebounds.

**(15-6) South Choctaw 64, Wayne 33**

Kate led the charge again with 19 points as the Rebels raced out to a 21-8 first period lead in their road win in Waynesboro. Arielle scored 11, Lauren had nine and Trystan had eight.

**(16-6) South Choctaw 96, West Alabama 7**

There have been some sure enough blowouts in girls' basketball over the years, but this one takes the cake. After leading 52-2 at halftime, the Rebels used all backups to pile it on, 44-5, in the second half. Lauren Jackson and Evelyn Todd each had 14. Cortney Mozingo had 12 and Kwasniak scored 10 with 11 steals.

**(17-6) South Choctaw 61, Sumter 35**

Arielle Campbell scored 14 of her game-high 21 points in the second period alone, as the Rebels continued their dominance over area-foe Sumter. Kate also scored 21 and Koen hit 10.

**(18-6) South Choctaw 69, Marengo 34**

Kate tallied a career high 31 points in the Rebels second win over Marengo. Campbell added 18 and junior Cierra Giles hit five.

**Area Tournament**

**(19-6) South Choctaw 82, West Alabama Prep 23**

Once again it was Bridget Kwasniak leading the charge in another blowout over the Lady Titans. Kwasniak hit a season-high 20 points in the Rebels first-round area tournament win that ensured them a berth in the Elite Eight.

**(20-6) South Choctaw 56, Sumter 47**

Really the only close call the Rebels had against an in-class opponent all season. South Choctaw actually fell behind 15-8 in the first period against Sumter, a team they had already beaten twice. With Arielle and Kate out for the second period with minor injuries, the Rebels rallied thanks to the defense of senior Randi Arrington. Arrington sparked a 19-5 second period run with eight points and five steals to lift the Rebels over Sumter for the area title. Kate finished with 21 and Lauren Jackson scored seven.

**Elite Eight**

**(21-6) South Choctaw 52, Sumter 30**

After reseeding for the final eight teams, South Choctaw drew Sumter once again in the Elite Eight. In this the fourth win over the Lady Eagles, South Choctaw once again wasted little time in taking control of the game with a 20-1 first period advantage. By the half, the Rebel were up 34-7 and a trip to the Final Four was sealed. Kate scored 25 points with eight rebounds, four steals and four assist. Campbell had 11 and Kwasniak scored six with four steals.

**Final Four**

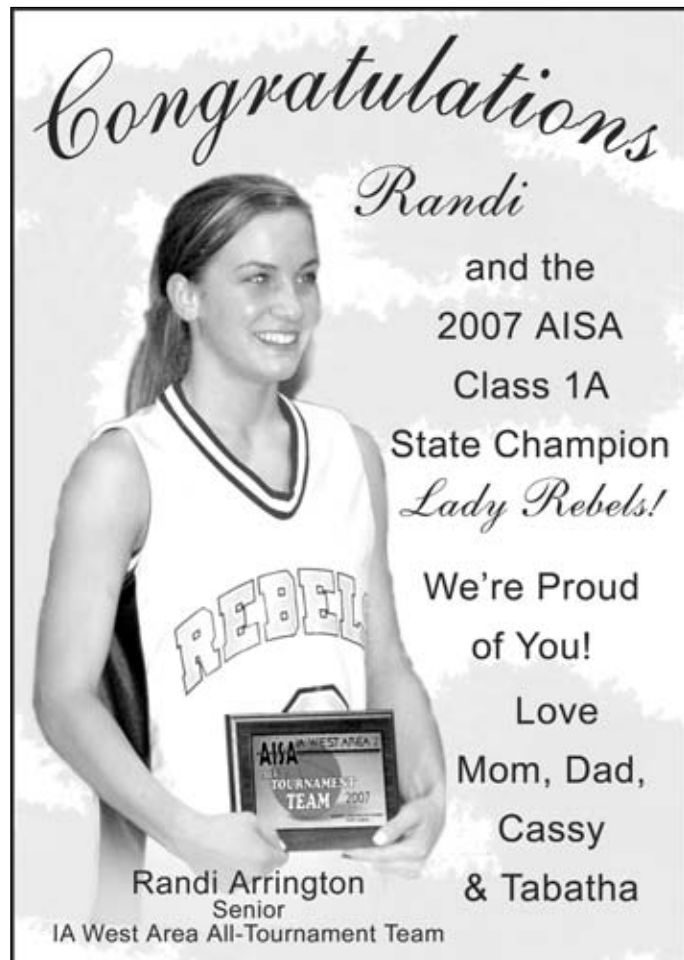
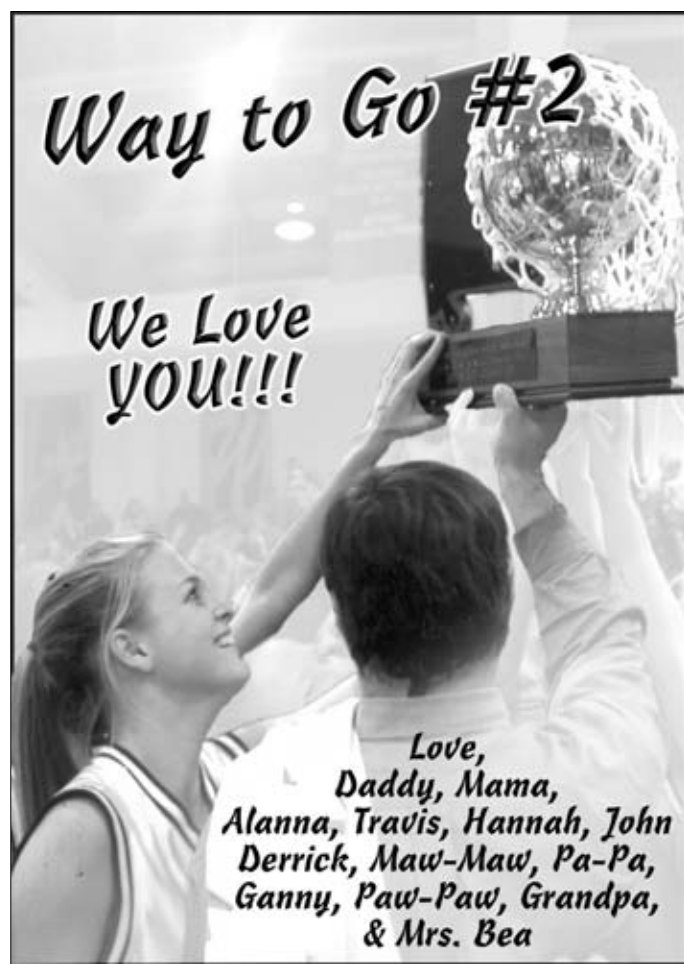
**(22-6) South Choctaw 47, Crenshaw 28**

Kate scored nine of the Rebels first ten points as they raced out to a 16-3 lead. Crenshaw would score just two basket in the game's first three periods as the Rebels rolled into the final to face Warrior, who had beaten Autauga to reach the championship game. In the Crenshaw win, Kate finished with 13, Lauren Jackson scored seven, and Kwasniak and Giles each had six.

**Championship**

**(23-6) South Choctaw 57, Warrior 44**

The Rebels used a 13-0 second period run to break open a close game against Warrior - a team the Rebels had already beaten earlier in the season - to claim the school's second state title in girls' basketball. Arielle might have played her best game of the season, dominating the post on both sides of the court to the tune of 18 points and three rebounds. Kate only scored 10 points, but was a factor with seven rebounds, seven steals and seven assist. Cortney Mozingo added eight and Koen Lindsey six in the Rebel win.



**Did you know the Rebels.....**

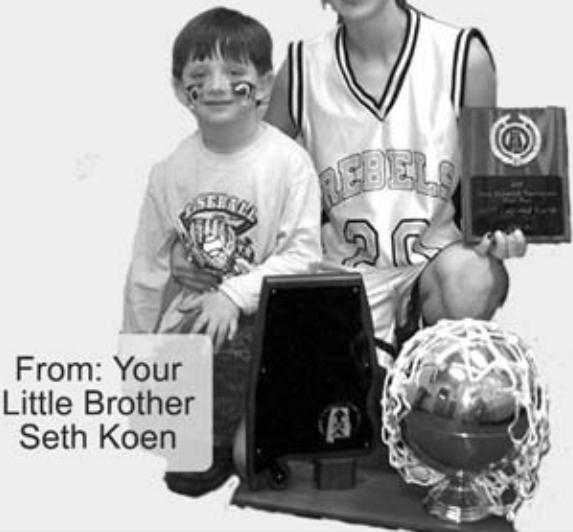
- ...outscored opponents 400-104 in the first period of their 23 wins. That averages out to a 17-5 first period advantage. Only one team that the Rebels beat, Sumter, scored double-digits in the first period (15).
- ...only trailed after one period six times all season (East Rankin, Oak Hill, Sumter, Wayne and Patrician twice.)
- ...gave up only 13 field goals combined in the first three quarters of their Elite Eight and Final Four games.
- ...were 16-0 against Class A opponenets, averaging a 34.5 margin of victory. Only one in-class team, Sumter, stayed within single-digits of the Rebels (56-47).
- ...after starting 4-4 won 18 of their last 20 games, including a season-ending 11-game winning streak.
- ...held 13 opponents under 30 points in a game
- ...have been to four Final Fours and have won two AISA Class A hoop's titles, once in 1995 and now in 2007.
- ...graduated all five starters and seven of the 13 players from this year's title team.
