Senior Chris 'Sweetpea' Carter was spectacular with nine points, six of which came on three high-flying dunks, and classmate Bryan Winston was once again on top of his game with nine points and two dunks. Senior Mikael Graham got the other dunk to account for his only points, while classmates Harold Williams and Dondricus Pringle scored eight and six points respectively.

Southern Choctaw (14-5) got 12 points, all in the first half, from junior Lorenzo Scruggs, along with six from Jamison Stewart and five from Dejon Fagan.

In the girls game, Choctaw County had little trouble beating the Indians 37-29 thanks to a 16-point night from freshman Kamille Horne. LaShonda James scored eight for the Lady Tigers with Alisha Keeton and Laquita Bush each adding four.

The Lady Indians were led by Angelica Gibson with eight, Bionca Boone with six

and Jekita Moody with four.

In the B-team game, Choctaw County picked up the win, 36-33, over a scrappy Indian squad that battled back from a 17-9 first period deficit. Phillip Ollison led the Tigers in scoring with 15 points and Phillip Evans helped with nine points, eight of which came in the game's opening period. Austin Taylor scored six for Choctaw County.

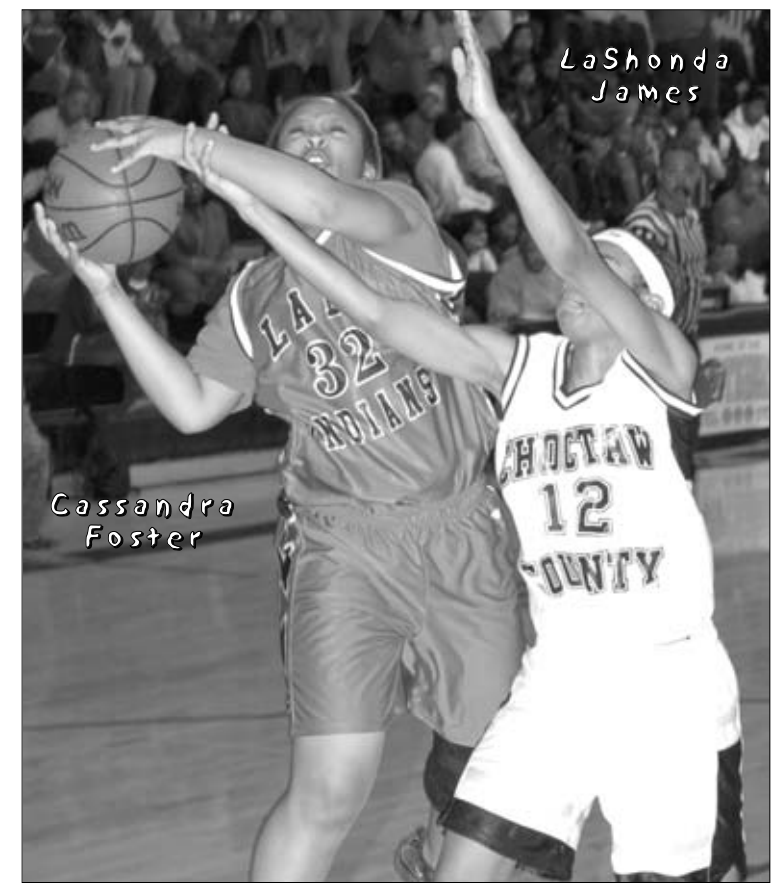
The Indians were led by Phillip Philon's 13 points, along with seven from Shaud Causey and five from Tori Adams.

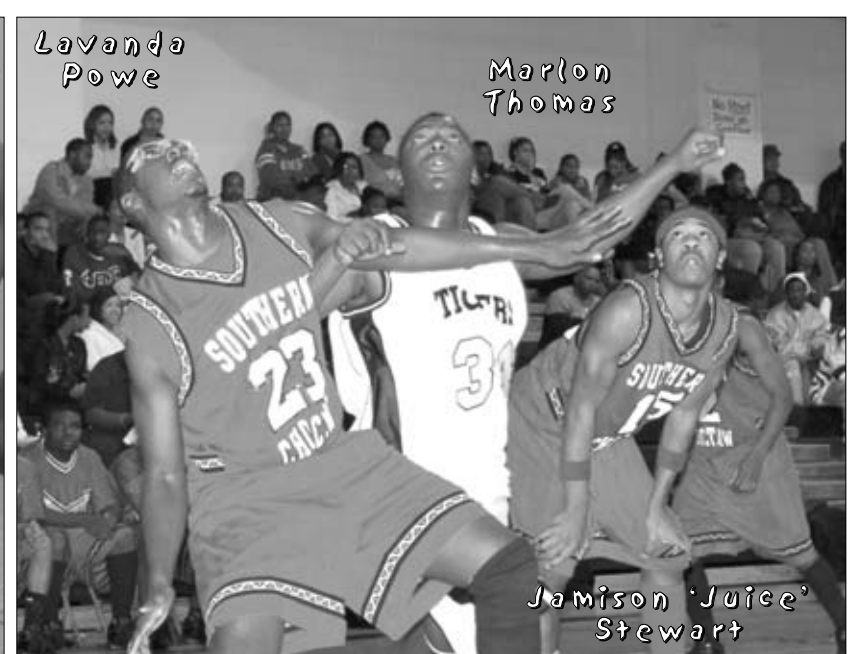
