## Quilting in Lisman

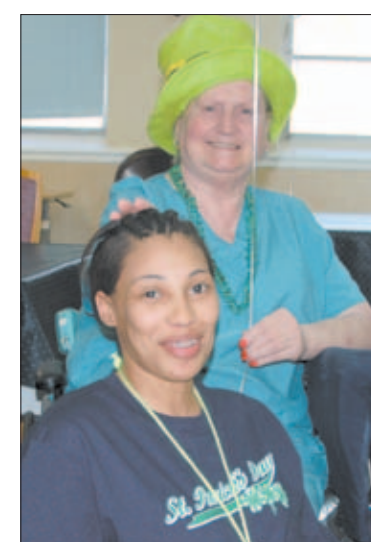
