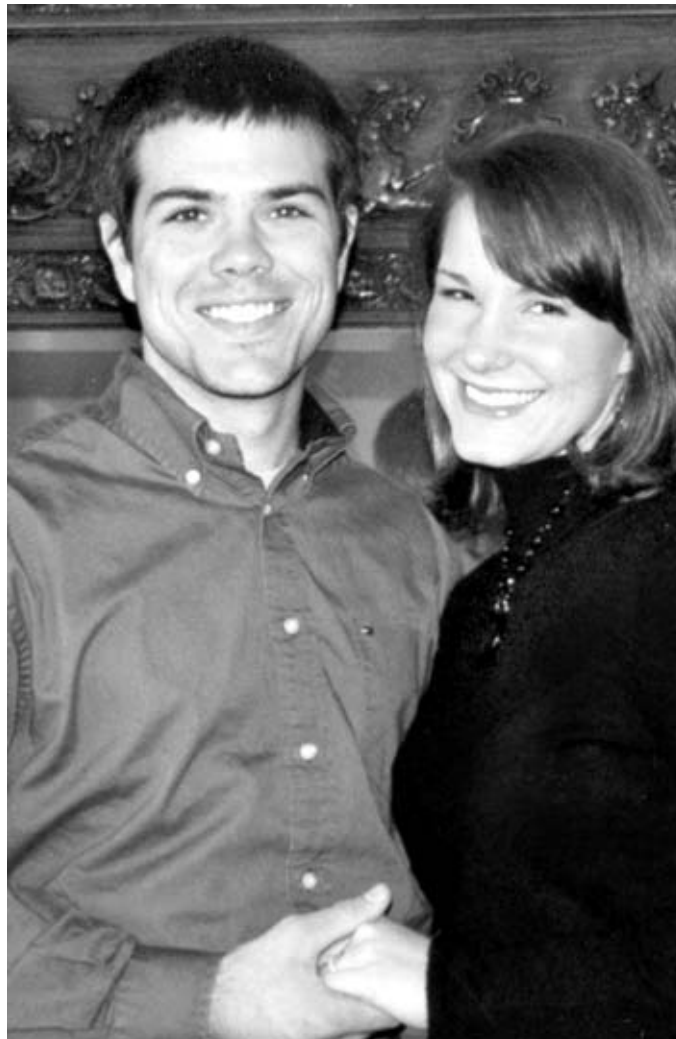
Murray, Gordillo-Ramos

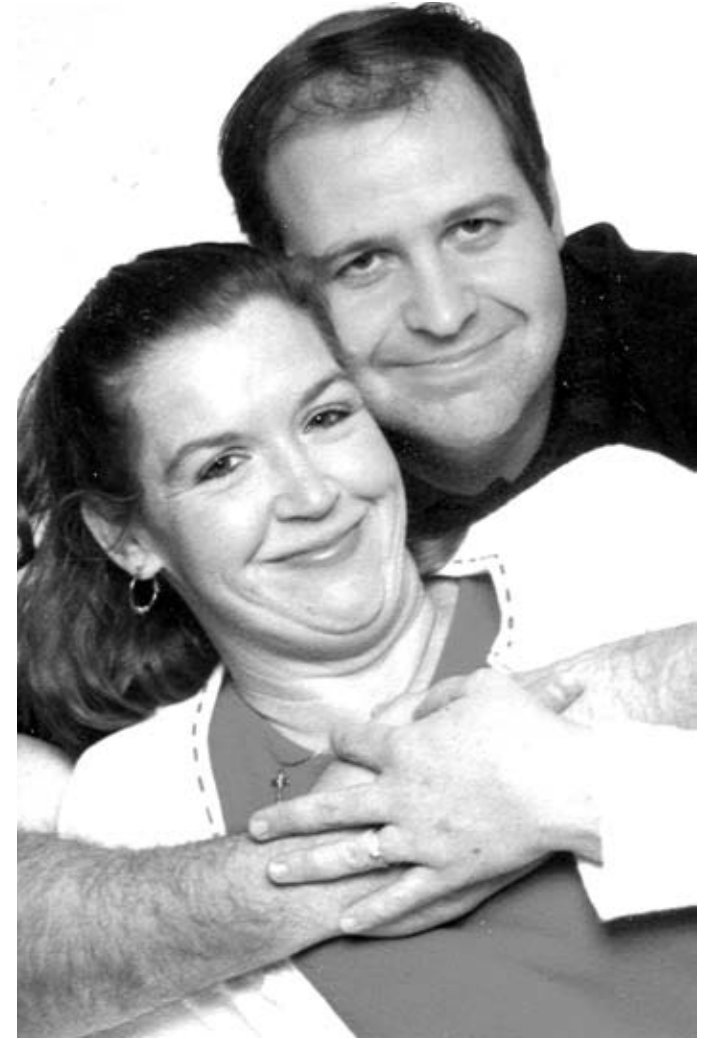
