Several parties were given for the couple. On Feb. 14, fellow co-workers at MMI honored the bride with a miscellaneous shower at the MMI golf house.

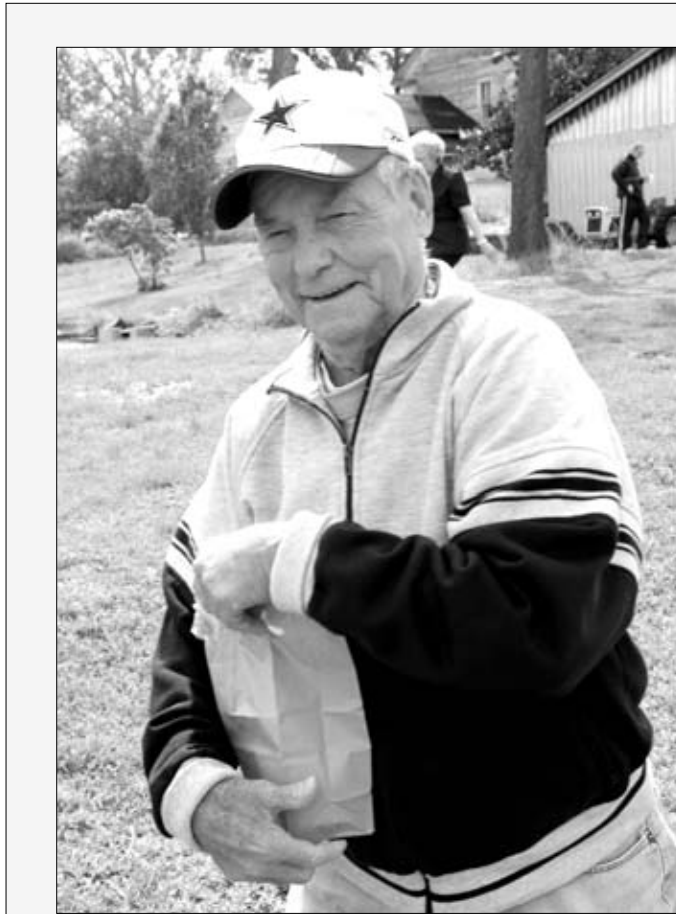

have Mayor Bobby Graham and Mrs. Alice Carlisle to come and enjoy the festivities with us.

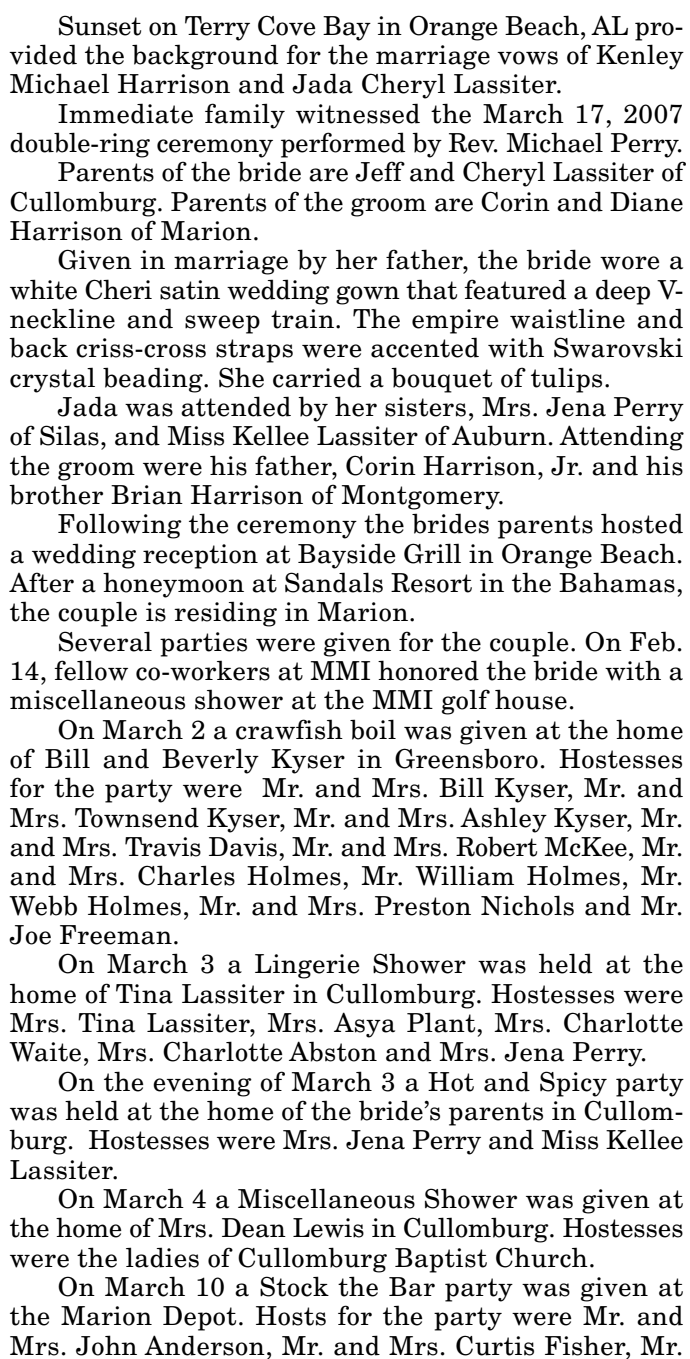
