All of the SGA promise to do their utmost to make next year a great year.

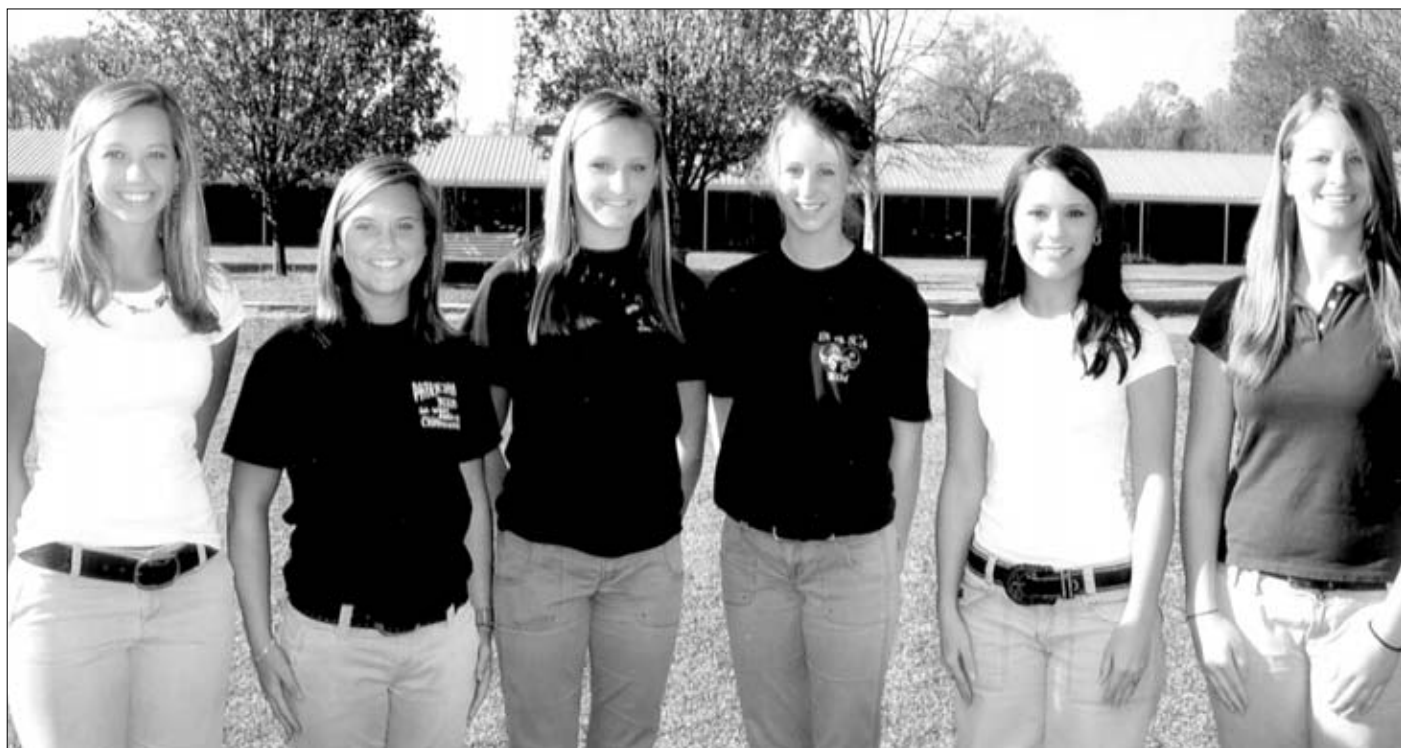

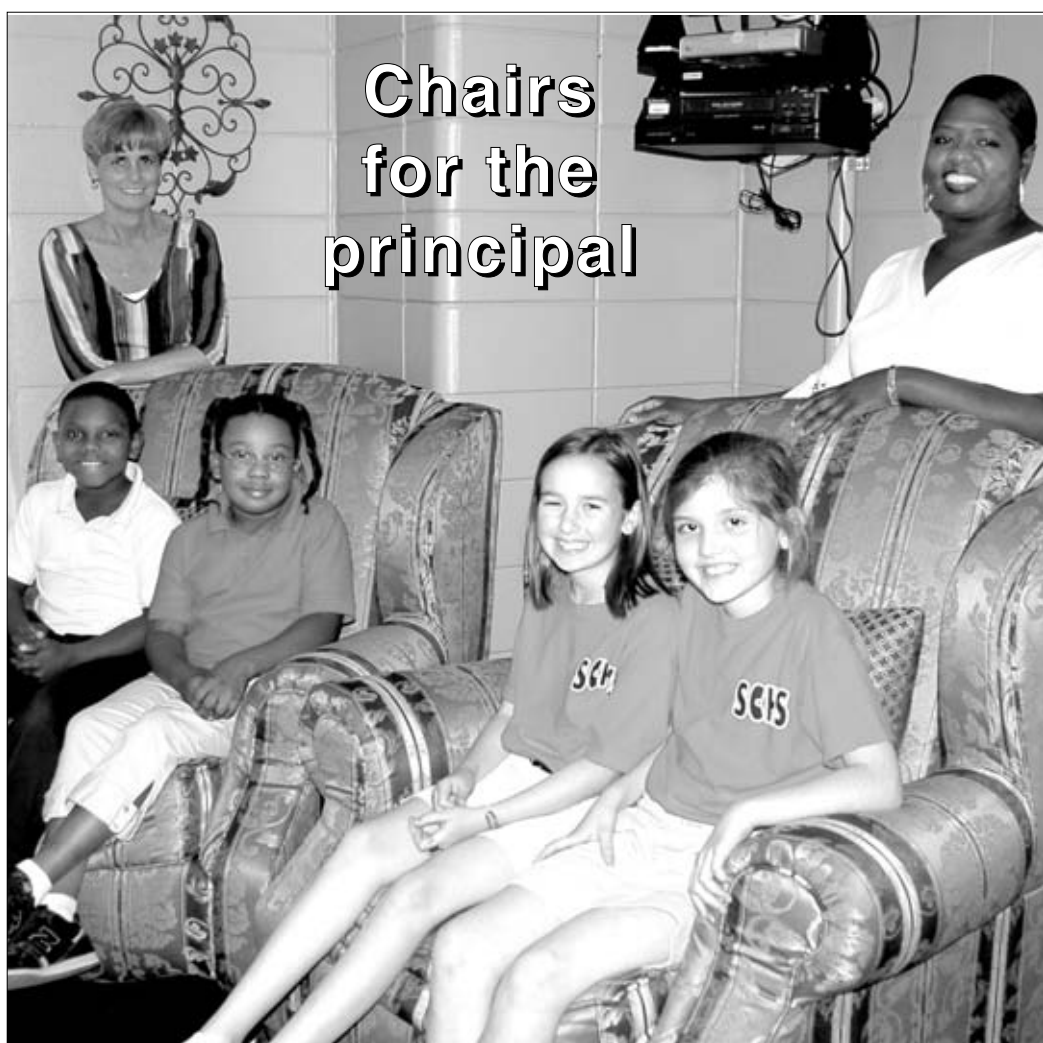
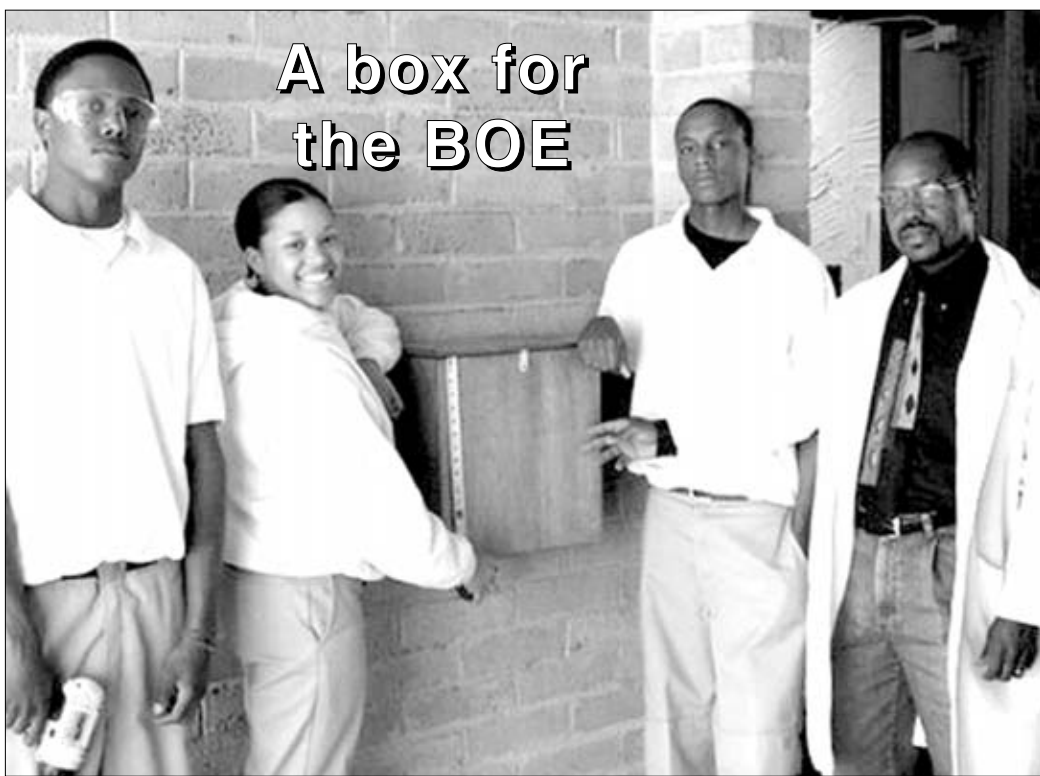
